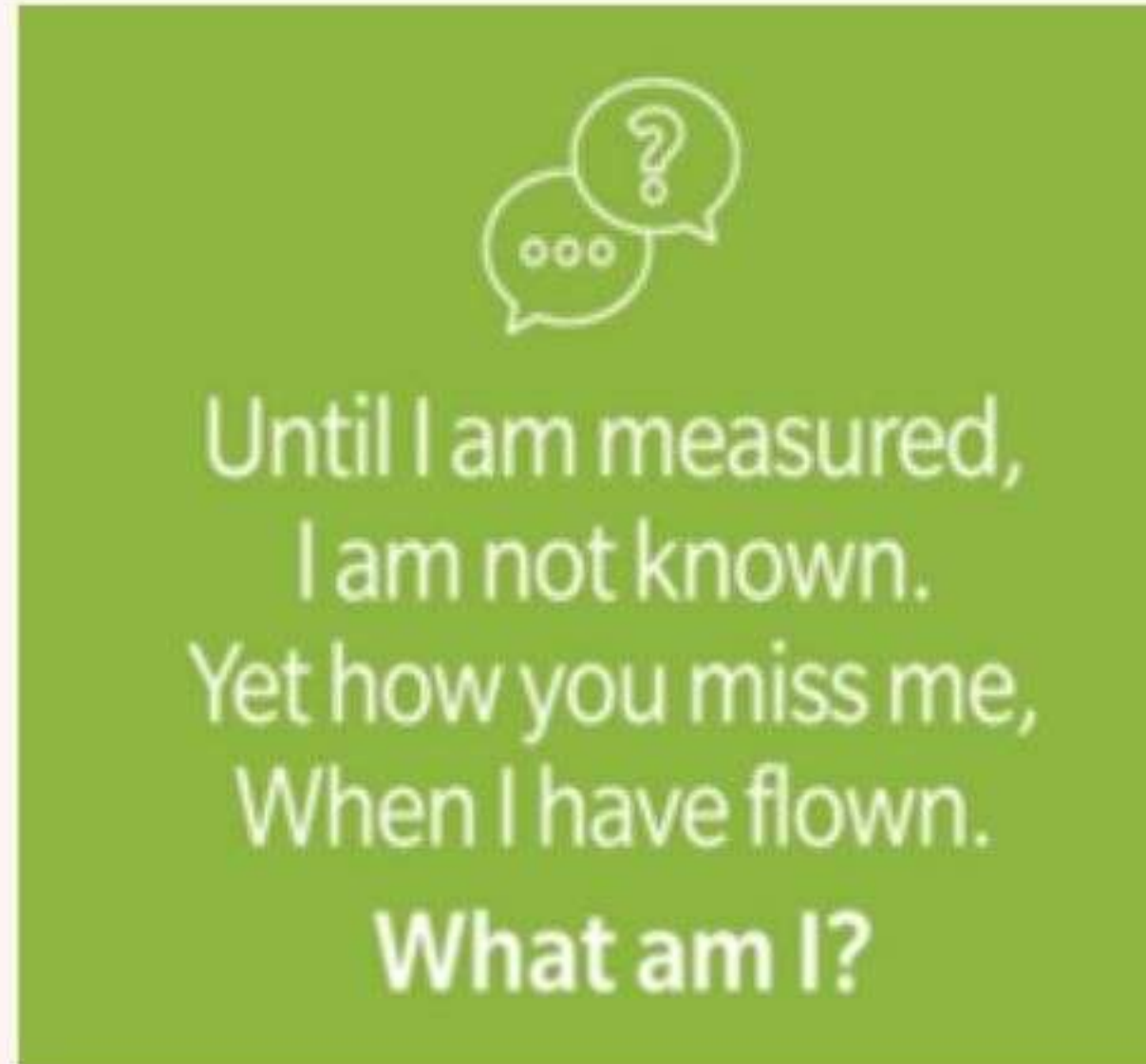

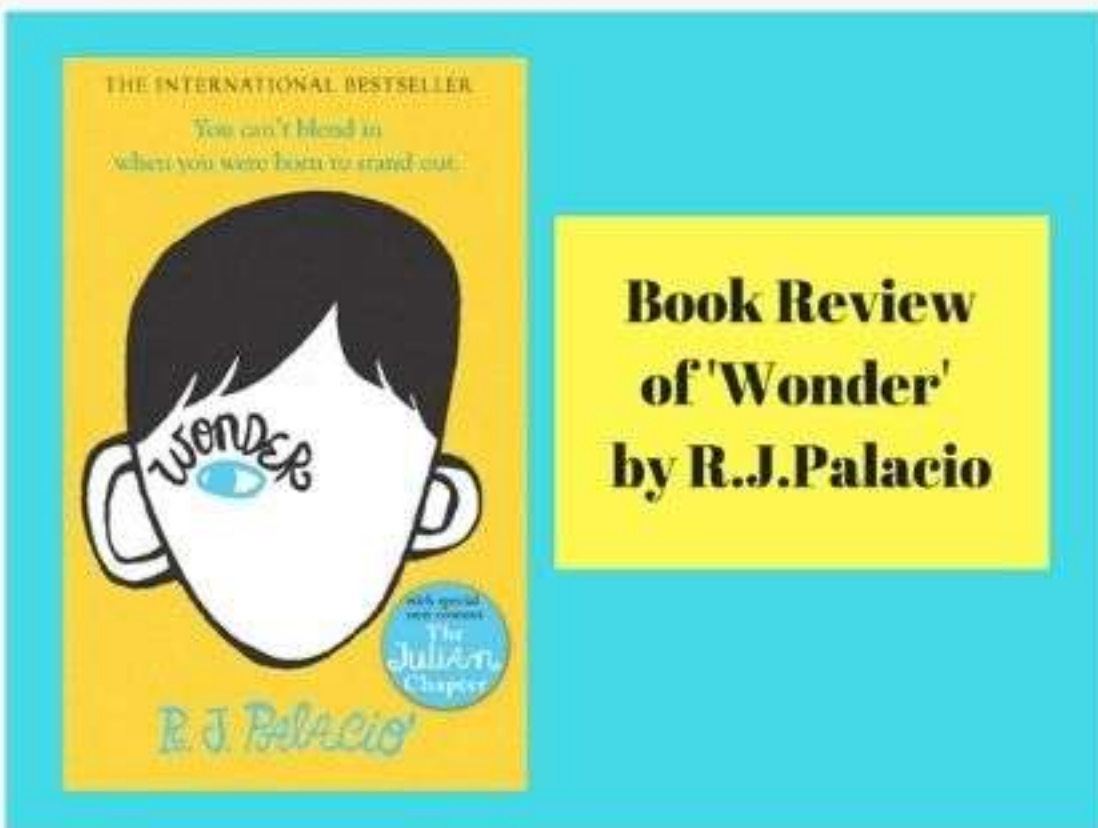

### WONDER BOOK RECOMMENDATION

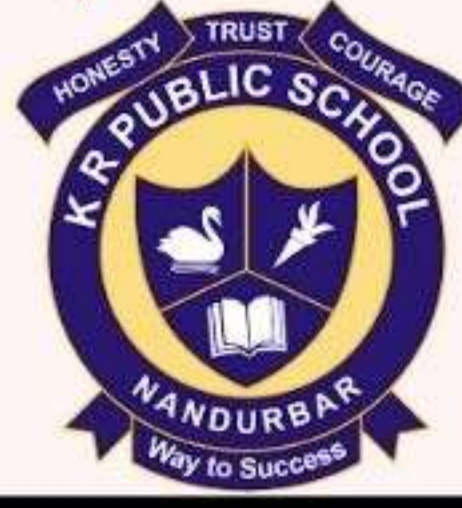


Book Review of 'Wonder' by R.J.Palacio
